

Know what's below! Call 811 before you dig



State laws require anyone who digs to notify utility companies at least three business days (72 hours) before starting, for good reason. Digging can be dangerous and costly without knowing where underground facilities are located.

Dig Safe is a communication network assisting excavators, contractors and property owners in complying with state laws by notifying the appropriate utilities before digging. **Dig Safe**, a free service, notifies member utilities of proposed excavation projects. In turn, these member utilities respond to the work area and identify the location of underground facilities. Callers are given a permit number as confirmation.

Digging is dangerous and costly if you don't know where underground facilities are buried.

Utility accidents are harmful to life, property and the environment. They also disrupt vital utility services and cause work delays, expensive repairs, liability for damages and civil penalties.

Damage prevention is everyone's responsibility.
